

Meditation on the Saving Power of God

Ez 37: 12-14; Jn 11: 1-45

COME, HOLY SPIRIT, COME

Our meditation is about God's promise to be with us, no matter where we are spiritually. He is there to help us rise from our sinfulness, to save us from our sins. But we all have some work to do since we are all sinners. We are just at different levels of sin.

One day a priest was called away from a children's party during Sunday school to visit a young woman. Her world had recently collapsed into an acute depression after her husband had died in a car accident. She had withdrawn from everyone. She wouldn't communicate with anyone, not even her children, because she said they reminded her of her dead husband. As the priest left the party, the children showered him with confetti which he brushed out of his hair and from his coat as he left to meet with the depressed woman.

When he arrived at the woman's house, he entered her darkened bedroom and told her who he was, but there was no response. He tried to carry on a conversation with her, but she was unresponsive.

He reached out to touch her hand, but it lay lifeless in his. So, he just sat with her in the dark silence for a time.

Then he decided to act. He wanted to see the woman face to face so he could pray with her. He turned on the bedside lamp and saw that she was weeping. As he took his handkerchief out of his jacket to give to her, confetti fell from it all over the bed. After a brief moment, the priest began to laugh. And that did it. First a smile appeared on the woman's face, and then she broke into quiet laughter. She reached out her hands to the priest in the joy of resurrection. They prayed together and she left her darkness to return to the light.

In the reading from the Book of Ezekiel, the key phrase from God is: "I have promised, and I will do it". Ezekiel had become a prophet while he was an exile in Babylon in 597 BC. God tells Ezekiel: "Tell the people I will open their graves and have them rise from them. I will put my spirit in them so that they may live. I have promised, and I will do it."

God heard the cries of the exiled Jewish people for mercy and sent them his spirit of truth to help them. He will do the same for us. This reading helps us see the promise of rising from our graves of sinfulness and dealing with every problem we have in our lives right now.

In the Gospel of Mathew, Jesus is presented as the resurrection and life for all who are dead, physically and spiritually when he raises Lazarus from the dead.

Our sinful lives can lead us to become spiritually dead. Whether we are dead physically or spiritually, we are powerless with no recourse to ourselves. We are fully dependent upon the love and forgiveness of Jesus. Jesus is not just a teacher but a savior and we all need a savior in our lives.

As Jesus approached the tomb, he saw Martha and Mary and the other mourners weeping due to their extreme loss. Jesus felt what it was like to lose a close friend. Feeling the same pain as we do when we have lost a loved one, Jesus began to weep.

Imagine Jesus weeping. We can actually sympathize with him. He feels the loss of his friend but he is also weeping because of our sinfulness. Sin is really the loss of our friendship with him. God responds with giving us the power to overcome sin.

The next time we tend to not take our sins very seriously, for instance we might think it is no big deal to commit a certain type of sin because everyone does it, like lying to our mom or dad or our spouse or cheating on a test or a tax return, let's keep this image of Jesus weeping because of our sins. Remember the sorrow he feels for our sins.

When Jesus asks the question: "where have you laid him?", he is looking for Lazarus. God is searching for his lost friend. He also looks for us whenever we are about to sin.

After Jesus arrived, he asked that the stone be rolled away, and then cried out. He shouts: "Lazarus come out!."

Imagine Jesus shouting, like the roar of a lion, followed by a deafening silence. He is calling Lazarus from his spiritual and bodily death.

We are all challenged spiritually to sin from time to time. We have all experienced some level of spiritual death. What level are we right now?

We may feel we have no hope but then we hear the voice of Jesus shouting for us to change our ways, to leave our lives of sin and death, to come out of our tomb.

The voice of Jesus can pull us out. He hates sin. He hates the way we place ourselves in the tomb of a sinful death.

Maybe we are sunk in addiction to alcohol or drugs. Maybe we are just mean and hard to get along with. We may be so ashamed of the things we have done that we have given up any hope of ever reconciling with God. We may have had a serious fallout with our spouse or our friends from school. It really does not matter what we have done. We are all at some level of sin.

The best news is that the voice of Jesus can raise us from being dead spiritually. Let's listen for the voice of Jesus to say: untie us and let us go". This is god's promise. Listen for his call.
