

Dear Brother Knights,

What most people realize is that insurance is based on age and health. Simply stated, the younger and healthier you are, the lower the overall cost. (And this includes long term care as well!) So if you are waiting to buy, it is never better later.

The reason I'm talking about this now is that I've had the first death on a policy I sold. She was perfectly healthy two years ago when I sold the policy. This policy has at least given the husband one less worry with all he has to work through. At least he won't have to take out a loan to pay for the funeral.

Also in the past few months I've had four people who have been "thinking about it" for less than a year who have had significant changes in heath. This will mean anywhere from an increase in premium to not being able to get insurance.

And lastly, my sister was killed in an auto accident last fall. Her insurance policy allowed one of her children to be able to keep the family home. (The one I grew up in and the one my grandparents owned.) Insurance doesn't make up for the loss, but it helps eliminate or reduce some of the other issues.

If you are currently "thinking about it," please give me a call so I can help you make that decision.
