Happy to hear that Bill Shoemaker and Ron Davis are on the mend after recent surgeries. Please keep all our Brother Knights and their families in your prayers.





GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation: How to Protect Us from False Prophets

2 Kings 23: 1-3; Ps 119: 33; Mt 7: 15-29

In the 2nd Book of Kings, King Josiah is identified as the king who ruled the Judah in 621 BC. Due to political in-fighting, the nation of Israel had been split into the states of Judah and Israel after the death of King Solomon in 931 BC. A very good king who pledged his allegiance to the Lord, King Josiah ruled for 31 years.

However, prior to Josiah, for over 2 centuries, the Jewish people had been ruled by terrible kings who had replaced the good priests and prophets with false ones. The bad kings and profits conspired to destroy all the books of old Jewish Law to turn the people to false gods. Without the books of the Jewish Law, even a good king like Josiah, was trying to serve the Lord by memory. A copy of the books of the Law was discovered by a good prophet and when it was presented to Josiah, he was so upset because he realized how far he was from complying with the Law that he tore his clothing.

The people of Judah have a good king and the books of the Law once again. They could have chosen to turn back from the pagan gods, but Josiah died in battle. Another bad king replaced him, the false prophets re-emerged, and the people turned back to worshiping pagan gods. As a result, the Lord removed his blessing from the people. They were eventually conquered by the Babylonians and many of the leading people were exiled to Babylon.

Psalm 119, written many years before this by King David, tells of the benefits following the law: "instruct me, O Lord, in the way of your statutes that I may exactly observe them. Give me discernment (or wisdom) that I may observe your Law and keep it with all my heart. Lead me in the path of your commands for in them I find my delight." In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus warns us of false prophets: "beware of false prophets, who come in sheep's clothing, but underneath are ravenous wolves."

We are forewarned! We want to avoid the kind of false prophets who led the Jewish people astray in the time of Josiah and who lead many people astray from the one, true God today. Some examples of this would be ministers who encourage their followers to practice devil worship or who push their followers to idolize power, prestige, money and acquiring things. Jesus tells us how we can recognize false prophets: by their fruit! Their fruit would include the quality of their deeds and what they do in their lives. How they live their lives is the **proper test of a good prophet. Is what they say is based upon a correct interpretation of Holy** Scripture or is what they say supported by the 10 Commandments? If what a person is saying seems to contradict Scripture or the Commandments, the person is a false prophet.

Could we be good prophets? Absolutely, but we need to let our words and deeds be good fruit for us and all of the people we come into contact with.
