

Meditation on the Call

2 Kings 4:42-44; Eph 4:1-6; John 6:1-5

Our Meditation is about the call we may receive from God to do some act of service, our response to the call, and how God may bless us when we call upon him in some way. It also tells us where our hearts and minds should be when we receive God's call or we call upon him to bless us in some way.

Teenagers often get criticized for spending too much time on their phones or playing video games but a young lady, Makenna Breading-Gooding, is setting an example for all of us. She is who has been collecting coats for people in need since she was 9 years old. After seeing a story on the news highlighting the needs of the homeless on the streets she felt the call of god to do something. She began by handing out flyers in her neighborhood asking for coats to be donated for the homeless. A few weeks later she went around with her red radio flyer wagon and picked up over 100 coats. By the time she was 15, she had collected over 3,000 coats for the homeless in the phoenix area. She even started a ministry with a website: Makenna's Coats for a Cause.

In the Book of Kings, Elisha calls a man, who had given him some food, to feed a large group of the people with the food. The man doubts that this little bit of food would satisfy the hunger of the people, yet he answers the call. We may have doubts when we go to God in faith for something to happen, especially when it does not happen immediately. We should always have patience when we go to God for something.

In his Letter to the Ephesians, St. Paul begged them to listen for the call of the Lord. He wanted them, and he wants us, to live our lives in a manner worthy of the call we receive. He urges us to be humble, patient, kind, loving, gentle hopeful, and enthusiastic in our relationship with God, willing to take chances.

John's Gospel about feeding 5,000 with 5 loaves and 2 fish, starts out with Jesus' loving care for the people who had come to hear him speak. It is the same care and compassion he has for each of us. While he intends to feed them, he wants them to realize that there are greater reasons for his coming. He tests Philip when he asks him where they can buy enough food to feed the people. When Philip does not answer this call from Jesus, coming up with excuses, Andrew jumps right in. He tells Jesus of the young boy with some barley loaves and fish. What Jesus does in multiplying the loaves and the fish in order to feed the 5,000 is so incredible that the people were convinced that he was the profit who had been promised to them over the centuries. They wanted to carry Jesus off to make him king.

Bishop Fulton Sheen, the great American theologian, described this as trying to make Jesus the bread king. The people wanted to make him king because he had satisfied their worldly needs: he had fed them. The people had missed the more important point of Jesus' coming:

Jesus came to show them how to live their lives, loving and serving god and each other. He wanted to save their hearts and souls for something much greater, a share of his father's heavenly kingdom.

Sometimes we may be reluctant to answer some call from god to serve him because we think that we do not have much to offer. Remember, what the young boy offered, the loaves and the fish, was not much either. The lesson here is that if we answer the call and give Jesus our minds, our compassion, our energy, even if it is very small, he will multiply it for his purposes.

Some of the greatest blessings or miracles in our lives, and in the lives of our family and friends, may have come after we answered his call or after we called upon the Lord in prayer. Maybe we endured some tragedy in our lives like the death or serious illness of a loved one or a job loss. The miracle is that we got through it while having the peace that only God can give.

So what can we take from our Meditation today? don't hesitate to call on the Lord in our time of need. He loves us and wants the best for us. He will get us through every situation, in his time and in his way. Listen for God's call to us and be prepared to answer the call, even if we think we do not have much to offer. Working and praying to be the best version of ourselves through faith, hope, humility, patience, love and the other virtues are the best ways to be ready to experience the fruits of the call.
