

### Mediation for KOC on Grandparents' Day

Gen18: 20-32; Ps 138:1-8; Col 2: 12-14; Lk 11:1-13

As you may know, on July 23, we celebrate Grandparents on the World Day for Grandparents. If we have grandparents in our lives, it can be something special. For grandparents, who have beautiful, wonderful grandchildren, and can help their parents nurture, protect, and instruct them, and pass on their experiences, it is really a blessing from God. Grandparents can also really be fun to be around.

In the Book of Genesis, we find Abraham actually debating with God. Because of the sinfulness of the people, God was poised to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah. Abraham had such a faith and trust in God that he was able to have God agree not to destroy the city if there were at least 10 innocent people there.

This reading makes me think about our beloved grandparents. How often, most of the time without us even knowing it, did they reach out to our parents, who were really mad at us for something we did, and intercede for us, just as Abraham did with God. They teach us to have the same faith and trust in God that Abraham had. They also teach us about forgiveness, respect for authority, and the need to listen to them as they pass on their wisdom to us.

Psalm 138 provides us with a list of all the things we can count on with God when we have a relationship with him. He listens to us. He is kind and true. He strengthens us for our journey in this life. He preserves us from the distress we will experience. He will reach out with his right hand to save us.

These are many of the things that our grandparents do for us if we have a relationship with them. We can go to them in times of trouble and they will do their best to save is. They strengthen us in so many ways but especially with their experiences if we listen to them. They are kind and generous to us with their time, talent and treasure.

In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul tells us one of the most important things ever: we are forgiven of our sins. This forgiveness came at a price: our brother, Jesus, died for us. He removed all of the sinfulness in our lives when he was nailed to the cross. He nailed our transgression to the cross.

We are sinners but if we ask for forgiveness, we will be forgiven. For more serious sin or just to received more of God's grace, we have the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Of all of the things we learn from our grandparents, probably the best are to see forgiveness when we do something wrong and also to forgive someone who hurst us in some way. When we hold on to our hurts from words spoke about us, mistreatments, injury, neglect, we are really hurting ourselves. We are forgiven and our grandparents teach us about the need to forgive in the same way.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus gives us some assurances that should be very comforting to us. First when we pray, do not be afraid to ask God to forgive our sins in the same way we forgive others. Jesus teaches us about generosity and that it is fine to be persistent in what we ask of God. If we ask and seek, we will find that we will receive. We will find the door we knocked upon to be open to us. Of course, we all need some guidance in the things we seek and ask for. We want to be sure the door we knock upon will open a better way to live our live. Here again our grandparents, with all their experiences they have in their lives will help guide us. They will be there to help our parents guide us to live our lives in such a way that we will be the best version of ourselves.
