

GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation- The Freedom to Choose

Rom 6: 12-18; PS 124: 1-8; Luke 12:38-45

Our Meditation today is all about freedom.

Through the sacrifice of His Life that our brother, Jesus made for us...

Through the Sacrament of Baptism which was established by Jesus...

Through these events, we are free from the slavery of sin.

However, with this freedom comes our free will to choose a different path than the one Jesus would like for us.

Jesus, of course, wants us all to go to Heaven. That is why He suffered and died for us.

However, the evil one is lurking, always tempting us to reject the life Jesus wants us to live. The devil wants us to choose a life of sinfulness, rejecting Jesus.

The choice is ours.

As we read this Meditation, let us reflect on where we are on this journey to heaven. Will we be ready when Jesus calls us?

In St. Paul's letter to the Romans, we are told that Christians have been released from the grip of sin, but sin tries to reclaim its victims. We can still be tempted and succumb to sin which is an instrument of the evil one.

This can be prevented by remembering that God's Grace claims us for only God's interests. Christians are supposed to be instruments in God's service.

As Christians, we are different from non-believers. We are entrusted with God's teachings that can be found in the Bible and the Catechism. From these we will come to know a new life that God aims to develop in us through the Holy Spirit. We cannot give allegiance to both God and sin. We must choose but we have the freedom to choose.

Paul emphasizes the freedom that Christians have but urges us not to choose sin. We are in the service of Christ. We are dedicated to Christ through our Baptism so that we can become like slaves to Christ and not to sin.

Psalm 124 is a thanksgiving prayer which recognizes that God is the reason for Israel's very existence. God rescued them from their enemies just like God rescues us from the evil one.

Israel is compared to a bird freed from the trapper's snare.

We should have the same feeling of freedom. We are freed from sin. This feeling can really be accentuated every time we go to Reconciliation.

I know whenever I go to Reconciliation, I feel like I am 10 years old again. I am free from sin!

We will all be tempted and will fall from time to time but our loving and merciful God is there to free us from the trapper's snare.

In the Gospel from Luke, we are told of the importance of being faithful to Jesus to the very end of our lives. In other words, never give up!

When we are tempted, if we fall, and keep on sinning, thinking that we will one day seek God's forgiveness, we may find ourselves unable to do that. This could happen if we were to die suddenly.

The punishment for us, who know better, may be more severe than for those who are not in the know.

The better thing to do is to fight off the temptation when it comes, asking the Holy Spirit to be with us to shower his Grace upon us. This will give us the strength necessary to fight off any temptation.

But if we fall, quickly ask God for his forgiveness and, for a more serious sin, get to Reconciliation as soon as we can.

So what can we take from this Meditation:

From the sacrifice of Jesus and our Baptism, we are free from sin.

We will be tempted to sin.

We have the free will to choose.

If we do fall to the temptation, ask for God's forgiveness immediately and, for a more serious sin, get to Reconciliation as soon as you can.
