After a life-long career in the publishing industry with Open Court, McGraw Hill, Scott Foresman, and Pearson Education, -a consulting opportunity at Pearson facility in Chandler, Arizona facilitated their decision to relocate.

Lee and Debbie were married in Arizona celebrating with Lee's six children and Debbie's son and daughter. Combined the couple has sixteen grandchildren.

After 10 years in Arizona they decided to move closer to her daughter and family in Mt. Pleasant.

Debbie, a Northern Illinois University graduate, worked as Admission Director at Saint Bede Academy for 20 years before moving to Arizona with Lee. She then decided to pursue her passion for writing, achieving Amazon #1 best seller status with her memoir, "A Beautiful View." Debbie is a contributing writer to 39forLife, a relationship expert for Cupid's Pulse, columnist for Seville Living and is currently working on another book.

GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation on the Good and Bad of Knowledge

Eph 3:2-12; Is 12 2-6; Luke 12: 39-48

Our Meditation today gives us some good and bad news.

It points out the knowledge we need to live our lives as Jesus would like and of God's plan for salvation, for everyone to go to Heaven

It reminds us how important it is for us to share this knowledge with others so that they may be saved too.

Finally, and this is the bad news, as we gain this knowledge of God's plan for salvation of the whole world, we will carry an extra burden compared to those who do not have this knowledge.

But it is a burden that we should be willing to carry because it leads to peace, joy and happiness in this world, to the extent possible, and to being with God in heaven someday.

As we look at our Gospel reading from Luke, we can understand that it relates to Jesus' return at the end times and how important it is to be faithful to Jesus' instructions.

It refers to a steward, who is someone that gives service to the Christian community. A steward, who is faithful to the community, will be given greater responsibilities, which will, of course, come with greater benefits.

Knowledge of what must be done to be a good steward has to come from the Grace of God, individual study, as well as from people who are courageous enough and informed enough to pass on what is needed.

Personal study is important. We have a saying in Cursillio that we cannot love somebody that we do not know. We need to study about our God to know him better and to love Him more.

Study is something that we must do, regardless of age. A study bible is an excellent foundation as is the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Also good books and videos from great Catholic authors like Scott Hahn and Bishop Robert Barron are excellent resources.

Once we have the knowledge of what is required of us to be good stewards, and we put that knowledge into action by sharing it with others, we will be richly rewarded. However, if people with this knowledge are unfaithful, if they do not carry out their duties faithfully, there could be severe consequences.

But the people who do not have the full knowledge required to be good stewards will be punished less severely because of their lack of knowledge.

We have choices: do we want this knowledge because we desire to be the best stewards, with greater benefits or do we chose to purposely fail to study so that we will be ignorant of what it takes. While we will be punished less severely than those unfaithful stewards who have the knowledge but fail to pass it on, the benefits will be less.

So what have we learned from this Meditation: with God's Grace, from our individual study, and the help of other Christians, we will receive the knowledge to be good Christian stewards.

We have a choice of being the best stewards we can be. If we choose to be faithful stewards, we will have peace, joy and happiness on this earth to the extent possible and we will have other benefits that are eternal.
