


Did you know - Bob Fintak

Mediation on Challenges To Our Faith

gn15:1-6; 21: 1-3; Ps 105:1-6; Heb 11:8,11-12,17-19; Lk 2:22-40

We are challenged to sustain and increase our faith in God which gives us a special blessing: the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give. Faith in God is our complete trust that no matter what we have going on, God will get us through it, in his time and in his way.

Let's begin by asking ourselves: where are we with God's peace, joy and happiness? Do we have it? Could we use more?

In the first Reading, Abraham, is having a crisis of faith. He actually gets mad at God. We have all of been in situations where we might get mad at God because of something that is going on with us: we failed a test, we get fired or demoted from a job, a loved one is ill or dies. This reading tells us we can get mad with God. He can take it. It also teaches us that we need to be patient when we ask God for something. His time is not our time.

Abraham and his wife, Sarah, were very old when God promised them a child. As time went on without a child, Abraham angrily complained to God but Abraham finally decided to put his faith in God. In his time and in his way, God delivered on his promise: Sarah became pregnant and Isaac was born. They were filled with the peace, joy and happiness because of their faith in God.

Our Psalm tells us the Lord remembers his promise to us, and that those who seek the Lord will rejoice. God promises that he will get us through every situation, but in his time and in his way. We may be in for some very difficult times in 2021 but if we have complete trust in God, and we lives our lives as we should, we will ultimately rejoice because God's peace will be there, even in the worst of times.

Our reading from Hebrews recalls the challenges to Abraham's faith in God. Because God found him worthy of these challenges, St. Paul presents him as a model for all believers. The most severe was when he was asked by an angel to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, to God. Despite serious misgivings, Abraham was prepared to sacrifice his son to God until an Angel told him not to do so.

We need a faith like Abraham in our God, who fulfills promises, who does the seemingly impossible at times. We only need to think about some of the miracles in our lives. The Gospel reading shows us the faith in God of Mary, Joseph, Anna, and Simeon. Mary and joseph are devout Jews who, in faithful observance of the old Jewish law, present Jesus to be blessed at the Temple. They meet Simeon who was very old and looking forward to death. God had told him that he must first see the Messiah before he dies. Simeon, inspired by the Holy Spirit, proclaims that Jesus is the one. His faith in God is rewarded when he experiences the joy and happiness to now die in peace. He predicts problems for the holy family but this faith-filled family remains calm as their trust in God is complete. This is where we need to be. When difficulties come this year, and they will come, we need to remain calm, trusting in God. It pleases the devil when problems disturb a family's peace, joy and happiness.

This humble family is faithful to their Jewish traditions. After fulfilling the requirements of the old Jewish law, they return to their home where Jesus grew, became strong, and was filled with wisdom. The favor of God was upon him. This Holy Family had the peace only God can give. Although they would suffer serious problems, including the death of Joseph, and the passion and death of Jesus, they never lost their faith that God would get them through these problems. Their faith was ultimately rewarded with Jesus' resurrection and Mary's assumption into Heaven.

How do we increase our faith in God? We can do so by increasing our personal prayer time, receiving the Sacraments as often as we can, and surrounding ourselves with good Christian friends. What can we take from these readings? During 2021, we will all experience problems, some more serious than others. We will be challenged to keep our faith to trust that God will get us through every situation, in his time and in his way. All families need to support and encourage each other to keep their faith in God during difficult times. Our faith will give us God's peace, joy and happiness, even when we are going through problems. Let 2021 be our year for faith in God.
