



GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation for the Knights of Columbus

Jonah 3: 1-10; Mk 1:14-20

This Meditation teaches us about our need to repent and our need for a prompt response to God's call.

We all receive calls from God, but we may need to slow down, get into a silent mode so that we can hear his call above all the noise we have in our lives. A call from God! That is pretty amazing when we think about it. What does God want us to do? What does God want us to be? His call is worth listening to.

We might be called to repent and leave a life of sin, to remove those friends from our lives who are leading down the bad path or to end a sinful relationship.

Maybe we are being called to make a Cursillo weekend or an Emmaus retreat. Perhaps God is calling us to overcome an addiction like to over-eating, alcohol or drugs; to get in better shape, to serve in some ministry at church, to be an altar server, or to be a priest, deacon or religious.

Here is a true story about receiving the call from God. One Saturday night, a Baptist minister was working late and decided to call his wife before he left for home. It was about 10:00 pm, but his wife didn't answer the phone. The minister let it ring many times. He thought it was odd that she didn't answer but decided to wrap up a few things and try again in a few minutes.

When he tried again, she answered right away. He asked her why she hadn't answered before, and she said that it hadn't rung at their house. They brushed it off as a fluke and went on their merry ways.

The following Monday, the minister received a call at the church office, which was on the phone that he had used that Saturday night. The man that he spoke with wanted to know why he had called on Saturday night. The minister could not figure out what the man was talking about. Then the man said, "it rang and rang, but I didn't answer."

The minister remembered the mishap and apologized for disturbing him, explaining that he had intended to call his wife.

The man said, "That's okay. Let me tell you my story. You see, I was planning to commit suicide on Saturday night, but before I did, I prayed, 'God if you're there, and you don't want me to do this, give me a sign now.' At that point, my phone started to ring. I looked at the caller id, and it said, 'Almighty God'. I was afraid to answer but decided it must be a call from God and did not go through with it."

The minister's church is called "Almighty God Tabernacle".

The Book of Jonah has an interesting back story. Jonah, a Jew, was called by God to preach repentance to the people of Nineveh.

Otherwise, if they did not repent, God was going to destroy the city and everyone in it. They were not only a wicked and sinful people, but Nineveh was the capital of Israel's most powerful and feared ancient enemy: Assyria. Needless to say, not only did Jonah not want to help these terrible people but he feared for his life if he went to this center of hatred and violence towards Israel. Through a perilous journey that included being in the belly of a fish for 3 days, Jonah relented to God's call and accepted this mission to preach repentance

To his surprise, and some disappointment, the people repented and God relented in his decision to destroy Nineveh.

The point is that there is no limit to what God can accomplish in us if we allow ourselves to follow the will of God.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus challenges the people to believe in the Gospel, the good news that God is a forgiving, loving, caring and merciful father who wants to save us from our sins.

He wants them and us to know that the Kingdom of God has come. It is here. The Kingdom of God is in our hearts. It is all around us. He also called us to repentance. He wants us to change our minds and the direction of our lives, setting new priorities. Repentance means hating sin itself, not just being sorry for the consequences of our sinfulness.

Jesus called Andrew, Peter, James and John to join Him in His ministry, to change the path that their lives were on. The important point is that they did not hesitate to accept His call and neither should we.

Jesus is calling us today as well to look at our lives. Are there some slight changes we need to make? We may even need a complete makeover. That is between us and God and maybe our spiritual director. We all need a spiritual director.

However, our prime motivation in life should be to love Him and serve Him and to bring those persons He has placed in our lives to the knowledge of the unconditional love He has for them

We need to appreciate God's call to us. Our own, unique vocation should enable us to become what God wants us to be. As St. Francis de Sales once said: "We are expected to bloom where we are planted."

The amazing truth is that, like with Jonah, God is relentless in calling us back to Him, even when we stray from Him.

Let us thank God for His divine grace of calling us to be members of His true church. Remember it is our vocation to lives our lives as Christians, transmitting the love and light of God to all the people we meet. We will do this by living our lives, radiating Jesus' unconditional love, mercy, forgiveness and humble service to all we come into contact with.
