





GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation: To Be a Servant Leader

1 Peter 1: 18-25; Ps 147: 12; Mark 10: 32-45

Our meditation today allows us to see what a servant leader really is from Jesus' point of view. It will also show us that the Apostles were not quite there yet and how the Holy Spirit can play a part in us becoming servant leaders.

In the First Letter of St. Peter, we are reminded that we are all given a chance to be redeemed from a life of sin by the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We have the option, the free will, to choose a life of holiness. This is a truth that the world does not want us to know. When we say yes to a life of holiness, our lives are purified by our obedience to this truth. We love God and each other intensely with a pure heart. This leads us to salvation, a life with God in his eternal Kingdom. We will also have the peace, joy, and happiness in this life that only God can give.

in Psalm 147, we are invited to praise God who is visible in nature. He blesses us with our children, grandchildren, our nieces and nephews; with peace on our borders; and with abundant food. We have other opportunities to experience God, to see the hand of God in our lives. This will be especially true as we draw closer to him in our holiness. I like to call these God-incidences, which are like co-incidences, except God is involved.

We can draw closer to God in holiness by increasing our prayer life, attending Mass regularly, and receiving the sacraments. As we do, we will become servant leaders. We might ask ourselves: "Can I be a servant leader?" The answer is yes!

Everyone can be a servant leader. We just need to pick our times and places. For example, instead of just telling someone who is hurting in some way that we will pray for them, let's say a short prayer with them right then and there; with the love of Jesus in our hearts, reach out to a new person in our communities or at our work places and make them feel welcome; refuse to participate when people are gossiping against someone; lead a blessing at dinner. There will be plenty of opportunities to be servant leaders. The danger we face is not from the lack of opportunities but from thinking more of ourselves than we should when we do good things.

This may have been the situation for the James and John in the Gospel of Mark. These 2 Apostles, along with Peter, formed Jesus' inner circle. They were doing some amazing things and learning how to live their lives from Jesus. They should have been servant leaders already but they went to Jesus and asked if they could sit at his right and left side in Heaven. In other words, they wanted a place of glory. We might ask what they were thinking. As part of Jesus' inner circle, shouldn't they have known better? Jesus gives us a good example of what a servant leader is by his words: "whoever wishes to be great among you, will be your servant. Whoever wishes to be first among you, will be slave of all." Jesus also showed us what a servant leader is by his life: he gave up his life to save the human race from sin. i suppose we can give James and John some slack. After all the Holy Spirit had not come upon them yet to give them courage (remember they deserted Jesus in the garden on the night he was arrested), or knowledge and wisdom. Once the Holy Spirit came upon them at Pentecost, they became true servant leaders.

What we need to do each day is to ask the Holy Spirit to come upon us and to make us wise and courageous servant leaders. The Holy Spirit is waiting. Let's take advantage of this.
