



### Meditation about the Mustard Seed

### Deacon Kevin Campbell

### Mk 4:26-34

When Huldah Bontain was very young, her parents were missionaries, serving in Japan. After they moved back home to Canada, she vowed never to leave. But God had a different plan for her. She met and fell in love with Mark Bontain, a Christian evangelist. After they married, they had a chance to lead a mission in Calcutta, India for one year. Even though she had said that leaving Canada was not for her, she thought she could endure anything for one year. So they sold their car, packed up their clothes and newborn daughter, and boarded a ship for India in 1954.

They started with a tent on a vacant lot in Calcutta and began telling people about the love of Jesus. One day a man entered the tent and said, "Preacher, fill our bellies and then tell us about God in heaven." That encounter changed everything. It was a mustard seed moment that sparked a tremendous ministry that continues to this day. It has reached hundreds of thousands of people. When Mark passed away in 1989, over 20,000 people attended his funeral. One of these people was her close friend; St. Mother Theresa, who encouraged her to carry on their excellent work.

There have been many mustard seed moments in history as well as those that occur every day which follow the same pattern: someone does something small, with God as the center focus, and good things will happen.

bishop Robert Barron gives good examples of mustard seed moments in the history of the Catholic Church. Like St Paul stepping from Asia Minor to Greece, spreading the good news that Jesus wants everyone, not just Jews, to be with him in Heaven one day. These small steps lead to all of Europe and, eventually rest of the world becoming Christian. This was a mustard seed moment for Christianity.

The Franciscan Order began with a young man who heard a voice speaking from a cross in a broken down church in Italy. The voice asked Francis: "restore my church which is falling apart". While Francis knew it was Jesus speaking to him, at first he thought he meant the church he was standing in. God had greater plan which he laid out to Francis. A few men joined his efforts, then hundreds, and then thousands and today we an order that brings the Gospel message to people throughout the world.

The Missionaries of Charity was started by a little nun who, while riding on a train going to her annual retreat, heard God calling her to leave her life as a teacher to serve the needs of the poorest of the poor in Calcutta, India. With no money, no helpers, and no institutional support, St. Mother Teresa started a ministry that now has 4,500 nuns actively working in 600 missions, in 133 countries

Bishop Robert Barron calls this the mustard seed principal: God begins in small, quiet ways. From these quiet beginnings, great things emerge. He tells us don't be afraid to do small things at the prompting of God. We might feel that there is nothing we can do which would possibly make a difference. When we look at all the evil in the world, all the injustice, all the indifference, we might feel powerless, useless. No one will pay attention to us. People will laugh at us. They might think we are unrealistic dreamers just like they thought St. Paul and St. Francis were. Don't worry about what they think. We have to have the courage to plant the seed. Make the move. Take the risk. Don't worry about the naysayers. They are always out there.

So if we feel this compulsion, this inspiration from God, to sow the seed, go ahead and do it, even in the smallest way, and leave the rest to the mercy and providence of God. As Bishop Barron says: "this is the great mustard seed principle which has guided many leaders of our catholic tradition." May it guide us today to look for those mustard seed moments. Allow God to use us to grow his Kingdom on earth. While there will be the trials and tribulations that are a part of life, we will have the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give.
