
Let me close my first GK report with an excerpt from the Knights of Columbus prayer from the <u>Fathers' Manual</u> by A. Francis Coomes, S.J.


After the meal The Family of the Year Greg and Stasi Gormley were presented with the Family of the Year Certificate from our Past Grand Knight Joe Nesbitt.

The Knights of Columbus Rev Vincent Capodanno Assembly #3243 once again held its annual Flag Day ceremony aboard the USS Yorktown at Patriot's Point in Mt. Pleasant. 

GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation on Trusting in God

Ex 3: 13-20; Ps 105; Mt 11: 28-30

Our Meditation today help us deal with situations, events, or people that God puts into our lives that seem impossible.

In the Book of Genesis, we have Moses. He was tending sheep for his father-in-law, Jethro, when he meets God for the first time. God is speaking to him from the burning bush. He is being directed by God to lead the Jewish people out of slavery in Egypt. God wants Moses to go to the king of the Egypt, Pharaoh, and tell him to let the Jewish people go. If this wasn't so serious, it would be hilarious. Yet God promises to be with Moses on this seeming-ly impossible quest.

In Psalm 105, the Palmist, most probably King David, speaks about God's promise to Moses. He calls it a covenant and says: "the Lord remembers his covenant forever". The Lord's initial covenant was with Abraham when he promised to make Abraham's descendant as numerous as the stars in the sky. If This covenant was to be continued, the Jewish people had to be led out of slavery by Moses, which he did with God's help.

The Lord then made a covenant with King David that his kingdom would last forever. This seemed an impossibility as well but it was brought to fulfillment with the birth of Jesus.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus is telling us we will face many seemingly impossible tasks in our lives: like loving our enemies, including those difficult people in our lives; living as people of truth and honesty, especially when it would be simpler and safer to go along with the crowd.

The important thing is that whatever problems or burdens we have, and we will have them, cast them upon Jesus. Give them over to him and don't take them back. He is there to help us live our lives as he would like us to. God is faithful to us if we remain faithful to him. He will not let us be tried beyond our strengths and will each trial he will provide us a way out if we remain faithful to him.
