Brother Knights Our 14th Annual Golf Tournament Is For Our New Beneficiary Carter May Senior Living

Here's a write-up explaining who they are and what they do: Carter May Senior Living founded in 1929 and located in West Ashley, serves seniors as the only Catholic assisted living facility in South Carolina. The founders, Monsignor James J. May, his sister Marie May and Mrs. Patrick Carter, had a vision to provide supportive care to seniors in need. Over the years the facility has grown so that it can serve more people, including retired priests in need of care. Facility staff provide seniors with meals, housekeeping and laundry services, assistance with activities of daily living, and medication management.

In 2016, The Hospitaller Sisters of Mercy joined the ministry, offering their specialized training in medical field and most importantly, their heartfelt aim of Caring for the Sick. Their congregation was founded in Rome in 1821, and continues to thrive today. They work around the world administering hospitals, nursing homes and assisted living residences.

Proceeds form this year's golf tournament will be used first to support the Hospitaller Sisters as they minister to the seniors and secondly to make interior improvements and upgrade furnishings in the facilities so that residents can live more independently and in greater comfort.

Director of Catholic Charity Lydia Davis thanked our council for supporting Carter May Senior Living.







Meditation on God's love for Us and Obeying His Commandments

Jn 14:15-21

Our Meditation centers on two important and related topics: the love God has for us and obeying his Commandments, the Word he has given us.

There is no ambiguity with God when it comes to love. So many people are caught up in false notions that God is a god of anger, a judge spying on people, ready to pounce and to punish; that he is a God of conditional love. If we do this, he will love us but, if we do that, he will not love us. That he is a God of law who is concerned more with rituals and what to do or not to do; or else he is a distant God, far off, not interested in the human condition and human suffering. Jesus tells us that our God is a God of love. God's love for us is so great that he never lets go of us, never gives up.

In all of the world's great religions, people seek God; however, Jesus introduced into the world an unexpected reversal. He reveals a God who seeks us, a God who loves us far more than we love ourselves.

He is a loving, compassionate, and forgiving Father. Jesus came to reveal the true face of God, a God of love, truth, and light. Sometimes we like to think, "God loves me because I am so dedicated and unselfish or because of my special qualities or my great personality."

We do nothing to earn this love of God. It was there before we existed. Let us be grateful for this truth: that God's love for us is based on nothing we do. Even when we sin, God's love continues to love us; he never gives up; however, as we all know, our actions speak louder than words.

Jesus tells us in John's Gospel, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." In other words, love is measured more by what we do than by what we feel. Nevertheless, some obey Christ's commands more out of fear than love.

A religion based solely on fear of punishment or hope of reward tends to seek loopholes. How far can I go before I sin? How much can I sin before I sin gravely? How little can I give and still satisfy my Christian obligations?

On the other hand, a religion based on love seeks opportunities. What more can I do to help? Is there anything you need? Do not hesitate to call me at any time. How much can I afford to give to support the renovation project? Love seeks only to be of service.

A good question for us is: what is our relationship with God? Is it based on fear or on love? Fear tends to paralyze, love releases. Fear imprisons, love frees. St. Augustine said, "When you truly love, you will automatically do good."

Keeping God's Commandments and his Word are the fruit of his love, not the cause of it. The Lord says: "If you love me, keeping my commandments is sure to follow." We do not initiate this love. God does. Love always starts with him. Our Lord is not setting up some kind of loyalty test: "If you love me, prove it by keeping my Commandments". This is not the Gospel! The Gospel message is that God loved us before we were ever born, before we could do anything to merit his love. He loves us even when we are stuck in our sinfulness.

If we accept his love, it will enable us to love God with the same love. With his love in our heats, we will love what and whom he loves. We will love holiness, forgiveness, mercy, justice, compassion, chastity and generosity. We will love everyone, even those persons we do not especially like. Why? Because God loves them. When his love is in our hearts, so is his love for them.

Love enables us to keep his Word, to live it and to love it. If we let love have its way with us, it will change our hearts and our desires. Love is the power of grace at work in us to love what and whom God loves. Let's take that love and share it with everyone we meet. This is what Jesus wants for us.
