-He became a Marine after school and was deployed twice but unfortunately while training for a third, severely injured his back.

-Although he suffered in pain, Michael held firm to beliefs. During this time, he and his girlfriend found out they were going to be parents. During the pregnancy, they were informed the baby would be born with significant challenges. Michael knew abortion was not an option.

-After Kaitlin Marie was born, she was put on life support. Using a cup of water from the ICU, Michael baptized her.

-The toughest decision a 22 year old Marine ever had to make was removing her life support. The family prayed, sang, and celebrated her brief time on earth.

-Today, Michael is honorably, medically discharged from the Marines and plans to start college here in Charleston soon in the medical field.





GOD BLESS AMERICA

Speaking to Others about God Deacon Kevin Campbell Acts 5:27-33; Ps 34; John 3:31-36

Our Meditation is about speaking to others about God. We all believe in God, but do we let others know it? We should be bold in holding ourselves out as Christians to others, even if there might be some cost for doing that. This grace of proclaiming the faith in public is one of the specific effects of our Confirmation, which empowers us to speak boldly about Christ. When we use this grace we all have, we will be richly rewarded. It will lead us to a peace that only God can give; it will lead us to heaven.

In our first reading, the Apostles have just experienced the risen Lord. What joy that must have been! They have gone from losing their leader by a horrible crucifixion to having him appear to them, giving them his peace. Now there is no stopping them from proclaiming their belief in the risen Christ to others. This is especially true to members of the Sanhedrin who handed Jesus over to the Romans to be put to death. The Apostles has just fled in terror when the soldiers came to arrest Jesus. They just denied even knowing Jesus. Now they are boldly and courageously proclaiming their belief in him, even if it costs them their lives.

While we will most probably never have to worry about being put to death for proclaiming our love for Jesus, there will be times when we are called upon to stand up for our faith. a good example might be to hold hands and say a blessing before our meal in some public place. Our psalmist, most probably King David, tells us what he does when it comes to proclaiming his faith in God: "I will bless the Lord at all times. His praise shall ever be in my mouth." This is a wonderful practice and we should all try to do this ourselves.

In our Gospel reading, John, who had a first-hand experience with the risen Lord, tells some very comforting words: "whoever believes in the Son has eternal life."

When we are able to tell others about our personal experience with God and when we are able to boldly proclaim that we are Christians to others, especially to those who are not, we will be showing our belief in Jesus. This will lead us a peace that only God can give and will lead us to eternal life with him in Heaven one day.
