


EXEMPLIFICATION OF CHARITY, UNITY, AND FRATERNITY

Guest Speakers From Pro-Life Charleston Holy City Mobile Pregnancy Center




Above is a picture of the Prenatal Mobile Clinic that was brought to our location and Brother Knights toured the Mobile Clinic.


Stand-Up for Life


Here we have a recent picture of Scott in his Christ Our King/Stella Maris security shirt.

GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation on the Most Holy Trinity

St. Augustine was walking by the seashore one day, attempting to find an explanation for the mystery of the Trinity. As he walked along, he saw a small boy on the beach, pouring seawater from a shell into a small hole in the sand. "What are you doing, my child?" Asked Augustine. "I am emptying the sea into this hole," the boy answered with an innocent smile. "But that is impossible, my dear child," said Augustine. The boy stood up, looked St Augustine right in the eye and replied, "What you are trying to do – comprehend the mystery of the Trinity even more impossible." Then he vanished. The child was an angel sent by God to teach Augustine a lesson.

When we consider the Trinity, the key word is mystery. There are at least 3 ways to approach it: we can disregard it or not believe it. Jesus called these people: the wise and the learned. These were code words for the scribes and the Pharisees. Today we call them close minded and the arrogant.

A second way is to say I fully understand and comprehend it. This is somewhat questionable. St. Augustine, one of the greatest theologians of all time, who wrote the book about it, called: "On the Trinity", said 30 years after he had written the book: I do not fully understand what I have written."

The third way is to just accept it. Jesus called these people: the child-like. Later he would say: "the only way to get to heaven was to have a child-like faith in me".

It is important that we realize it is not a problem if we do not fully comprehend the Trinity. What we need to do is to try and understand what we can, and then build on that.

So how do we go about taking whatever our understanding of the Trinity is and building upon it? When we pray, it is important to remember that we have only one, true God. Then we focus on the special role of each person of the Trinity: first, we have our heavenly Father, to whom great praise and glory must be given because he created us. Jesus called God, the Father: Abba or Daddy. We can have the same intimate relationship with God as our Daddy. We should refer to him as Abba, our Daddy.

Then we have our Brother, Jesus, who showed us how to live our lives. Out of love for us, he chose to suffer and die so that we would be in heaven with him one day.

Finally, we have our Friend, the Holy Spirit. He gives us his gifts including wisdom, understanding, knowledge and courage so that we can get through all of the trials and temptations in this life. He wants us to have the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give.

So, we have God, the Father, our Daddy, who is the creator of all things; God, our Brother, Jesus, who died and rose again to give us new life; and God, our Friend, the Holy Spirit, who gives us his gifts for our journey.

Daddy, Brother, Friend...

Let's think of them in this way every time we pray. When we do, we will enjoy a better understanding of this mystery. When we do, we will have a closer relationship with our Daddy, our Brother and our Friend.
