




Family of the Month Bob and Sue Fintak February 2018



Meditation- Listening to God and Obeying His Will By: Deacon Kevin Campbell

1 Sam 3: 1-10, 19-20; Ps 40: 2, 5, 7-10; Mark 1: 29-39

Our Meditation is all about listening to God and obeying His Will for us.

As we read this Meditation, let's ask ourselves, do we really listen to God? Do we really accept and embrace His Will for us?

In the first book of Samuel, he is presented as a very young man.

He had never heard God calling him before. God calls to him three times but he did not realize it was God calling him. It took an elderly and wise priest, Eli, to tell Samuel that it was God calling him. The fourth time God called, he listened and said: "speak Lord you servant is listening".

This is what we need to do. When I was going through the journey to become a Deacon, during the discernment period, I had an interview with Deacon Andre, a Priest and another Deacon, to check my spirituality, my prayer life. I was very proud to report that I get up early every day and ask God to help me, my family and friends with things, I read this publication and that book and another publication.

When I was finished, Deacon Andre asked me: 'Do I ever listen to God. It sounds like I am doing all the talking!" I realized that was true and I took his constructive criticism to heart. I began to listen to God. I go to a quiet place, try to get rid of all the noise and just lines to God. I have found that He talks to me all the time if I take the time to listen.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus is having a great day in Capernaum. He has preached in the synagogues, healed Peter's mother in law, healed all the towns' people that were brought to him and he drives out demons.

Many of us would have stayed around for the healing celebrations, enjoying the praises from the people. Not Jesus. He goes off to a quiet place to be alone with His Father, to pray and to listen to the Father's Will for Him.

Peter urges Jesus to stay and enjoy the moment. He says: "everyone is looking for you." But God had other plans for Jesus. Putting aside His personal enjoyment, Jesus follows the will of the Father. He says: "let us go to the nearby villages, that I may preach there too. For this purpose I have come."

When we take the time to listen to God, He will speak to us. He will let us know His Will for us. When He does, we need to follow His Will. We need to ask for God's Grace to embrace His Will even when it is inconvenient.

My Saturdays are normally filled up with things to do around the house or with church events or grandfather duties, all of which I love to do, but every so often, I will have a free Saturday which I call a me day. I get up early to pray but then I go to the athletic club for a couple of exercise classes. Then I jump in the hot tub and relax. This past Saturday looked like it was going to be a me day but then I remembered I had our first team meeting for an upcoming Cursillo weekend in Columbia. I could have gotten out of it but I prayed and the answer from God was loud and clear: go to the meeting! Well, I went and it was great. I would have been sad if I had missed it.

So what can we take from our Meditation today?

- Take the time to listen to God. It could be during our prayer time or even throughout the day but we must take the time to listen. We need to place ourselves in the right frame of mind to listen.
- Pray that we understand God's Will for us in small and large decisions.
- Accept God's Will for us, embrace His Will for us, whether it brings us pleasure or inconvenience.
