He practiced dermatology with his father, John Sr at the Maize Center for Dermatopathology for 9 great years (2003-2012) before joining his current practice, Trident Dermatology.

John and Siobhan will celebrate 25 years of marriage this coming October. They have two daughters, Katherine and Alexis.

Siobhan was born in Bangor, Northern Ireland to American parents but grew up in Connecticut and Northern Virginia. She moved to South Carolina to go to USC in Columbia because she wanted to go someplace warm. She and John met there and became college sweethearts! 

Did You Know - Jerry Barnett

Jerry was born in Rome, Georgia on June 23, 1936 but raised in Pennsylvania. Met and married Diana in 1977 and had boy/girl set of twins in 1979. Jason and Beth graduated from COK-SM & Bishop England. Beth went to Coastal Carolina University and graduated with a degree in Health Science. Jason attended The College of Charleston and graduated with a degree in Computer Science.

Upon graduating from high school Jerry joined the USAF where he served a year of his 4 in the Korean conflict. After leaving the military he went to work for Callery Chemical in Lawrence, Kansas. In 1959 he moved to Joliet, Illinois where he went to work for Amoco Chemical Company as a chemical operator. He holds an associate's degree in safety & fire protection from the university of Wisconsin and Joliet Junior College. In 1964 he was promoted to the position of Safety Superintendent & Fire Marshal which he performed until 1977. At that time Amoco was building a new plant in Cainhoy, SC. The current plant manager was being sent to run the new plant and he told me I was being transferred to set up the safety & fire protection plan. They are still using the safety program he implemented. After 36 years he finally retired in 1994.

Jerry is a member of the East Cooper Outboard Motor Club since 1977. He was on the executive board for 33 years in many different positions. After retiring from the board he was made Commodore Emeritus.

Jerry is a charter member of the K of C Council #9475 and the 4th degree K of C Assembly #3243. He helps with the book sale, wreath sales, food booth at the bazaar and Christmas Child.

He has saved the life of 3 people, one being his own daughter, by using his knowledge of the Heimlich maneuver and the same for a fellow worker at Amoco. Another time a lady was out in a boat near Amoco on the Cooper River at night, fell out of the boat and was hit by the motor prop. He helped get her to the hospital and saved her life.

Jerry is presently captain of the noon ushers and so very ready to get back to church.

Meditation on Listening to the Call of God

Gen 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18; Rom 8:31-34; Mark 9:2-10

Our Meditation leads us to ask: how do we know when God is calling us to follow his will for us and how should we respond to the call?

In Genesis, Abraham's faith to follow God's will was severely tested. he was instructed to take his only son, Isaac, and sacrifice him to God. Even though this was contrary Abraham's love for Isaac, he did not hesitate to obey God's will. The crisis was averted when God sent an angel to tell Abraham not to harm Isaac. Because of his faith and obedience to God's will, Abraham was blessed abundantly and became known as the Father of Faith.

In the book of Romans we are told something very important: "if God is for us, who can be against us?" This should give us great confidence as we deal with the problems in our daily lives. It will also help us if we are called to follow God's will in some way, great or small.

When we hear God's call and follow his will, he will be there to intercede for us. While we don't always know how things will turn out, we just need to keep going, follow his will, and trust him that it will all work out, in his time and in his way.

In Mark's Gospel, Peter, John and James answered the call of Jesus to follow him up a high mountain where they saw Jesus transfigured before them. This gave them a preview of how Jesus would look after his resurrection.

When Jesus went to be with Moses and Elijah, the disciples became terrified. Then God, the Father, called to them to listen to his beloved son. They accepted this call from God and their fear and terror left them.

As they went down the mountain, Jesus instructed them not to disclose any of this until after he rose again. While they were not sure what this meant at the time, after his resurrection, when it all became clear to them, they became leaders of the early church.

How do we know if God is calling us? A well-known author, and preacher, Charles Stanley, tells us: God's voice is always consistent with the Bible. Any message must agree with what God has already said in the Bible. His voice is quiet. God often speaks to our hearts through the Holy Spirit in an inaudible but compelling way. The Lord speaks clearly. If we'll tune our hearts to him by setting aside time to read the Bible and listen for the Holy Spirit to speak to us, he will give us clear guidance.

Whether to go on a mission trip, enter the seminary, attend a certain college, choose a career path or change the path we are on, join the Knights of Columbus or some other ministry at Christ our King, like Cursillo or Emmaus, God is constantly calling us to be the best version of ourselves. If we listen to him, answer his call, and obey his will, we will be richly blessed.
