May thy Salvation, O Lord, be always ours this day and for evermore.





### MEDITATION OF GOD'S LAW OF LOVE

### SIR 15:15-20; 119: 1-5; MT 5: 17-37

According to legend, Valentine's Day takes its name from a young priest who lived in ancient Rome. Like so many early Christians, Valentine was imprisoned because of his faith. He often thought of his loved ones and wanted to assure them that he loved them and he was ok. Beyond his cell window, just within his reach, grew a cluster of violets. He picked some of the heart shaped leaves and was able to write words of them like "remember your Valentine" and he sent them off with a friendly dove. He continued sending messages that simply said: "I love you". St Valentine loved God with all of his heart, soul, mind and strength and his neighbor as himself.

He loved God and his brothers and sisters so much that he was even willing to die for them, just as Jesus died for all of us, in order that the truth of God's love would not be denied. That happened on February 14<sup>th</sup> in the year 312. And so, through the ages, those who love, send valentine cards to express their love for one another on Valentine's Day.

I mention St. Valentine not only because Valentine's Day was a couple of weeks ago, but because choosing to love is a central theme of this Meditation and our Readings.

The reading from Sirach speaks to the choices we make. We can choose to do bad things, like being selfish, and eventually we will become selfish people. We can also do good things, like loving God and our neighbors, and we will become people of love. This is what God wants for us

The choice is ours. If we do choose to do bad things, this will eventually lead us to sin. Sin will always lead to problems in our lives. But we can never blame God. God never makes us sin. It is what we do when we make bad choices.

Psalm 119 tells us to love the Law of the Lord. If we do, we will be on the right path, the path that will lead us to having the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give, and a life with him in Heaven one day.

In the Gospel of Mathew, we are told that God wants to share his life of love with us. Love is a personal choice; it cannot be coerced. Love is to will the good of another person. God loves us unconditionally and wills us to love him and others so that we will be with him in Heaven someday.

God's Law, which comes in part from the 10 Commandments, is the way he helps us to make the right choices in life. God does not force or coerce us. We are the ones who choose. We will become what we choose. If we choose to be mean and arrogant, we will become that and be very difficult to be around. If we choose to forgive and to be a good listener, that is what we will become. It is our choice.

Some people think that Heaven is a prize, kind of like a Candyland of sorts, and that God just puts us in there. Actually, eternal life is a way of life, a way of being, a life of love. God cannot place us there. We need to choose our way there. Love is always a choice. We are here on earth for one thing and that is for us to reach a life in Heaven. The choice is ours to make.

The best way to prepare for Heaven is to love now. We will then become the type of person who is fit for Heaven.
