



GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation on the Good Shepherd

1 Jn 3:1-2; Jn 10:11-18

Come, Holy Spirit, Come

A man in Australia was arrested and charged with stealing a sheep after another man accused him of this act. The defendant claimed emphatically that the sheep, which had been missing for many days, was one of his own. When the case went to court, the judge was puzzled, not knowing how to decide the matter.

At last, he asked that the sheep in question be brought into the court room. Then he ordered the plaintiff, the accuser, to step outside and call the animal. When he did, the sheep made no response except to raise its head and look frightened. The judge then instructed the defendant to go to the court yard and call the sheep. When the accused man began to make his distinctive call, the sheep bounded toward the door. It was obvious to that judge that the sheep recognized the familiar voice of his master. The judge let the accused man go and had his accuser arrested.

The Gospel of John tells about the Good Shepherd. The Good Shephard is Jesus. He leads us to live our lives in such a way that we will have the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give in this life and to be with Him in Heaven one day. He does this because he loves us unconditionally.

In the First Letter of John, we are asked to consider God's unconditional love for us. It is a love so great that we are called children of God. We are part of God's family and He wants us to live our lives as His Son taught us and to be with Him in Heaven one day. Many of us may love conditionally: you do this and we will love you but if you do that, we will not love you. Not so with our God. He loves us no matter what we do. He does hate the sin, but not the sinner, and this is what He wants us to do: to live our lives loving Him and loving all the people we come into contact with.

But He wants more from us than that. He sees all of us as Good Shepherds who, by living our lives as He taught us, will lead others to Him. We can do this without saying a word. We can do this by just living our lives as good Catholics. This is true, no matter where we are in our lives: as a parent, grandparent, or other family member; a boss or employee; or just a good friend. By the way, we need to be proud to be Catholic. Never be afraid to hold ourselves out as Catholics.

The challenge for us today is to accept the gift of Jesus' unconditional love. We need to live our lives as He taught us. By our words of peace and unity and our acts of love, kindness, mercy and forgiveness we will bring others to know Him. If we lead, others will follow.
