

November Gardening

November is a great time for planting such things as: perennials, shrubs, trees, winter vegetables, spring flowering bulbs, winter blooming annuals, and seeds for spring flowering annuals. Overcrowded perennials showing a ring of growth and an empty center need dividing and this is the best time for doing it. You can divide Boston ferns into thirds, plant in 3 new baskets, and keep in sunny window until next spring. After finished blooming, cut chrysanthemums and asters back to 5" above ground. For bushier plants, pinch back newly planted snapdragons. Apply water-soluble 20-20-20 fertilizer to pansies and other winter annuals every 2 weeks.

Shred leaves for your compost pile or use for mulch. Now, when leaves are plentiful, is a good time to start a compost pile. Composting is one of the great rewards of gardening. When pulling up zinnias, marigolds, and other annuals with dried seeds, shake the seeds onto soil so you might have new plants in the spring. Leave dried seed heads of coneflowers and Rudbeckia for the birds to eat. Put out birdseed and keep birdbath full and clean to attract migratory birds.

If tea scale is present on undersides of camellia leaves, apply horticultural oil according to label instructions. Take all houseplants inside after removing any insects. The first frost can be as early as Nov. 15.

Clean up debris from plant beds. Clean your garden tools before putting away for winter. Add organic matter to soil. Are moles having fun tunneling all over your yard? They are very difficult to get rid of but knowing that they don't do damage to your turf can help keep you from being too concerned. Going around and stamping down all the raised tunnels is good exercise. They only have one main tunnel. The other tunnels are only used once.

This is the time when pink muhly grass is in bloom and is so strikingly pretty. These are great plants for our area. They are maintenance free, drought tolerant, have no pests or diseases, don't mind high humidity, and are good to plant along the banks of ponds and lakes to prevent erosion. They don't like wet feet and do like full sun. To get the full effect of the beautiful pinkish blooms, plant several together.
