GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation: the Problems of Discipleship

Job 9: 1-12, 14-18; Ps 88: 3; Luke 9: 57-62

Our meditation is about three areas of concern: when bad things happen to good people, what do we do when our prayers seem to go unanswered, and the problems with discipleship, when we want to follow Jesus. These concerns, which can shake the foundation of our faith, can be addressed with patience, persistence, and perseverance. With the help of the Holy Spirit, the 3 P's will give us the strength, wisdom, knowledge, and the hope to get through every spiritual crisis.

The book of Job is about the profound sufferings of an innocent person at the hands of the devil. God allows the devil to test Job. Job is a good and holy man. He is also very rich. Job suffers a severe and sudden reversal of his fortunes. He not only loses his property and his children, is plagued by some disease which effects his whole body, but on top of all of this, his 3 best friends are convinced that he is suffering from all of this because of some wrong doing on his part that has offended God. He vigorously denies doing anything to offend God. At first he is reluctant to call upon God for help: "If I appealed to him and he answered my call, I could not believe that he would harken to my words". Finally, he cries out to God to help him.

God answers him but in a way that we might not expect. God tells him that God's ways are not known to mere men and it is not right to question God's wisdom. It was God who created the world. This makes perfect sense to Job and, as he accepts this explanation, he returns to his humble-self and is eventually rewarded.

Our lesson is that even the just suffer. Sufferings will test our faith in God but we cannot understand the depth of God's divine wisdom. We just need to trust God completely. This can only come through a life of prayer and for this, we will be rewarded. Unfortunately, prayer, asking God to help us through some crises, is not like turning on and off a light switch. The key is to never give up, to persist, preserve, and have patience.

John Wesley, who went on to be the founder of the Methodist church, was going through a period of such spiritual dryness, that he thought we had lost his faith in God. His mentor told him to keep preaching and keep praying as if he had not lost his faith. If he did this, his faith would surely return to him and it did. He became one of the most influential preachers of all time.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus speaks of the sometimes difficult, but at the same time, unconditional nature of Christian discipleship: if you want to be a follower of his, you cannot do it on your terms but his. You cannot let things of the world distract you if you really want to proclaim to others that the Kingdom of God awaits them. The Kingdom of God, which can be here on earth, as well as in heaven, is just a different way of experiencing life than what the world presents to us. It can be filled with the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give, rather than the anxiety, fear, and worry that the world might offer us.

Some of what Jesus says might concern us: "Let the dead bury their dead". By this he means let those who are spiritually dead bury their dead. By this exaggeration, Jesus was trying to jolt his listeners into action. His statement about not having a place to lay his head was his emphasis on his lowliness, his humility. It is an example of how to live our lives, not concerned with worldly wealth, but with our love for him. This definitely challenges us to see if we are fit, if we are ready to serve God in this world.

So what can we learn from this meditation: Bad things do happen to good people, to us, our families and friends. As people of faith, we cannot allow any circumstance to damage our faith in God. That would be playing into the hands of the devil. We need the 3 P's instead: patience, perseverance, and persistence. We just need to continue praying as hard as we can for God's help to get through any crisis we are in. when I am in some crisis, I like to visualize holding on to the foot of the cross until the crisis is over. Following him will not always be easy but the rewards are eternal.
