

Meditation on the Greatest Commandments

Dt. 6:2-6; Mk. 12: 28-34

In the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses challenged the Israelites to love God with all their hearts, souls and strength, the God who freed them from slavery in Egypt and provided them with food and water while they traveled through the desert to the Promised Land.

This passage stresses the responsibility which each generation had to respect the Lord but also to instill this respect for the Lord in their children. They do this by telling and retelling the stories of what the Lord had done for them in their lives.

This is done by faithful Jews who celebrate the important feasts such a Passover each year with their families. They also repeat 2 or 3 times daily the ancient Jewish prayer, the Sh'ma: "Hear of Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. Therefore you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus, who as a faithful Jew would have daily prayed the Sh'ma, repeats this beautiful prayer. But he contrasts himself to Moses by saying that the greatest commandment not only requires us to love God but also to love our neighbor. Jesus was asked for the one, the best commandment and he seems to give two but the two are really inseparably one.

This is how much Jesus loves us: he laid down his life for us. As we know there is no greater love than this. His sacrifice is the Love Commandment. We obey the Love Commandment by worshipping God above all but also by loving our neighbor. St. Basil the Great, who is known as the Father of the Church, once wrote: "we can only express our love for God fully by loving our neighbors who are the image of God." The Catechism of the Catholic Church observes that man is created in the image and likeness of God. So the Second Commandment depends on, follows from, and completes the First.

St. John the Evangelist taught the world and us in his writings that God is love and that God so loved the world that he gave his only son and that he who loves God must also love his neighbor. St. John, who sat next to Jesus at the last supper and was known as the beloved disciple, was the best one to pass on our duty to love God and neighbor.

He once wrote: "Beloved, let us love one another; for love is of God and he who loves is born of God and knows God. He, who does not love, does not know God, for God is love. Anyone who says he loves God while hating his neighbor is a liar. For this is the commandment: he who loves God should love his neighbor also." If we speak untruthfully about our neighbor, if we act badly toward our neighbor, we dishonor our God.

Love is the only law we can live by. We love God because he loved us first. We love our neighbor because we can't love God, who we haven't seen, unless we love those made in his image and likeness, who we have seen.

The second part of the Greatest Commandment is sometimes very difficult to obey. Unfortunately, due to our humanness, our sinfulness, our pride and selfishness, it seems practically impossible to love some of our neighbors. The good news is that Christ knows it is possible. If it were not so, he would not have commanded us to love. So to love God and our neighbors, all of them, is a debt we owe and must pay. It may not necessarily mean dying on the cross as Christ did for us, but it could be demonstrated through small, but concrete gestures like a friendly wave, sincere smile, kind words and generous, timely charity.

We are called today to examine our hearts. Do we have other loves that get in the way of our love of God? Do we love others as Jesus loves us? Do we love our enemies and pray for those who oppose and persecute us?

Let us tell the Lord that we love him and let us take his words to heart that we do love our neighbor so that we might prosper in this life and have life eternal in his kingdom.
