

#### Meditation for KOC-What is Our Ideal

Ex 22; 20-26; mt 22: 34-40

This Meditation should lead us to a question: what is the Ideal of our lives? An Ideal is the sum of all of our goals and objectives in life. It is the source of true happiness. It makes our lives worth living and gives our lives meaning, purpose and direction. Sour our Ideal is pretty important.

How can we tell what our Ideal is? We should start by asking ourselves: what do we think about most of the time? what do we spend our free time and money on? That is probably our Ideal right now.

Here is a story that we may find some connection with. When Jane was 10 years old, she wanted to be an actor in the movies. She thought that this was her Ideal but it did not work out for her. This shows us that our Ideals may change as we grow older and become more mature.

As a young woman, Jane graduated from college, became a real estate agent, married and had children. She thought her Ideal was to be the most prestigious real estate agent in Charleston. she worked a lot during the week and just about every weekend. She did this to achieve her Ideal but it was to the detriment of her young family who needed her even more.

Jane then decided that her Ideal was to make as much money as she could by buying and selling rental property. she thought that this would make her powerful and put her in complete control of her life. These efforts took most of her energy, thoughts, time and money. she often missed valuable time with her family.

While these activities, becoming an actor, being a real estate agent, buying things, making money, being powerful and prestigious are not bad in themselves, she went a little overboard with them. They became more like idols to her. They were false Ideals because they would never lead her to have true happiness and personal fulfillment.

She considered herself to be a pretty good Catholic. She went to Church almost every Sunday and she was very generous in her contributions but she did not feel she had a very close relationship with God.

Then someone told her about the unconditional love God had for her. She was amazed by this. She had always thought of God's love as being conditional: you do this and I will love you, but if you do that, I will not love you. And that is the way she loved her family and friends.

Realizing that God loved her unconditionally changed her life. She began turning away from those things that had become idols to her: making money at all costs and having power, prestige and control. After all, none of these things gave her true happiness and they were causing problems with family. So, she decided to reduce the time and efforts she spent with real estate and focus more of her time on her family and helping people in need. She became more involved with her Church and committed to spending more time deepening her relationship with God.

It was not an overnight process. She eventually came to realize that loving God and loving everyone she came into contact with, especially her family, must be her Ideal.

In the Book of Exodus, we are given some examples of good goals: be kind to widows, orphans and the aliens living among us. Back then, they were vulnerable to abuse and oppression. They were often very poor. They had little or no economic or legal rights in a society that was dominated by men and tribal connections. They had to rely on the goodness, generosity and compassion of others for their survival. Helping these people is a great example of a goal in life but it is not necessarily an Ideal, which is the sum of all the goals in our lives.

In Mathew's gospel, Jesus was speaking with the scribes, who were experts in the old Jewish law, called the Torah. Over the centuries, the Jewish religious leaders had created over 613 laws to make up the Torah. They asked Jesus which was the most important. Jesus said love God and love your neighbor. He told them that the whole law and the prophets depended on these 2 commandments.

Jesus tells us that this love must engage us totally: our hearts, souls, minds, the very essence of our beings.

Let's make loving God and neighbor our Ideal. It will become the source of true happiness for us. It will give our lives, meaning, purpose, and direction. It will make our lives worth living. It will give us the peace, joy and happiness that only God can give and it will lead us to heaven.
