

Knight of the Month September, 2011 Albert Baciocco

- Native of San Francisco, CA. Entered U.S. Naval Academy in 1949, graduating and
 - commissioned an Ensign, U.S. Navy, in June 1953.
- Married Mary Jane Rivera of Coronado, CA, on 25 June 1955. Subsequently raised four children two boys and two girls all today married and living on the East Coast from Florida to Virginia. Nine grandchildren range in age between 27 and 5 years old.
- Served initially in the heavy cruiser USS Saint Paul (CA73) in the Pacific Fleet; then went into submarines and served in USS WAHOO (SS565), USS SCORPION (SSN589), and USS BARB (SSN596), then in command of USS GATO (SSN615).
- During these "at sea" years, the family resided in Pearl Harbor HI, Groton CT, Pascagoula MS, Vallejo CA, and North Scituate MA some locales multiple times.
- Following command of GATO in 1969, went to command of Submarine Division 42 here in Charleston, the start of an interrupted series of tours in the Low country, separated by repeated assignments in the Washington, DC, area.
- Retired from the Navy as a Vice Admiral on 1 April 1987, completing 34 years of distinguished service both ashore and at sea.
- After 7 post-retirement years in Falls Church, VA, in June 1994, relocated to current residence on Pitt Street in the Historic Old Village of Mt. Pleasant, SC.
- In April 1987, established The Baciocco Group, Inc., a technical and management consulting practice, and has since been engaged in a broad range of business and pro bono activities with industry, government, and academe, including service on the Boards of Directors of several corporations, both public and private.
- Became a 1st degree member of Knights of Columbus Council 9475, Mt. Pleasant, SC., in October 2009. Advanced through 2nd and 3rd degrees during 2010; installed as 4th degree Knight in August 2010.
- Became a charter member of 4th degree Assembly 3243 at Stella Maris in September 2010.
- Serve as member of Membership Committee of Council 9475, Mt. Pleasant.

Dear Brother Knights,

When Father McGivney started the Knights of Columbus 129 years ago, he did so to protect widows and orphans. We've heard it so often that we often forget about what it really means. To protect our family we usually have to look beyond our individual self-interest to protect those who are left behind. We frequently have to give up something today to pay for something that we may never use. In many ways, it falls under the umbrella of "charity." Charity to our family.

A year or so ago, when I sat across that widow who was insufficiently protected, it hit home to me. She did not know how she would complete raising her two high school kids. And then she had no clue what she would do after that either. It was the first time since I started working for the Knights three years ago, I didn't know what to say. I had no words of comfort. The check that was coming from the Knights for the protection her husband had, would cover the funeral and her for maybe a few months, but that was all. What a difference it would have made to her and her family had her husband had sufficient coverage. For their very existence they were going to rely on government assistance and charity. Simply put, the avoidance of this situation was the reason The Knights was started by Fr. McGivney.

If you aren't sufficiently protected, or simply don't know if your are, please give me a call and take the time to have me come over and speak with you. Charity starts at home.
