Back in NJ he was a member of Council 10206 & a Fourth Degree Knight in the Commodore Barry Assembly in West Milford, NJ. He made his First Degree in 1986, then the Second, Third Degree soon after. The highest rank he made was Chancellor.

Council 10206 is a small council, attached to Immaculate Heart of Mary Church in Wayne Township in NJ. With the decline in the ownership of real estate & independent club buildings, most of the new councils in NJ are attached to the local parishes.

At one point the Council was in sore financial straits. We began to lose support of the parish members. They wouldn't patronize our fundraisers. And our pastor was not very supportive. So the Council became more involved in financial issues. Meanwhile State required us to set up committees for:



GOD BLESS AMERICA

Meditation: Obeying God's Commandments

Ex 40: 16-21, 34-38; Ps 84: 2; Mt 13:47-53

Our meditation reminds us of the importance of obeying the God's commandments. They tell us what happens when we do obey whatever God tells us to do, including the 10 Commandments, and what happens to those who decide not to obey.

In the book of Exodus, Moses is following the command of God to build a sacred dwelling for the Ark of the Covenant, which contained the 10 Commandments, a jar of manna from the desert, and Aaron's rod. Moses strictly obeyed what God commanded him to do. This is the same for us. Sometimes we make things too complicated. The 10 Commandments are right there for us to study, learn and obey. While this not optional, we will have great peace and joy when we are welcomed into Heaven one day.

In Psalm 84, the Psalmist speaks to us about what Heaven meant to him: "My soul yearns and pines for the courts of the Lord. I had rather one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere. How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord."

In Matthew' Gospel, Jesus tells us what happens when we obey God's Commandments and what happens to those who do not: "the Kingdom of Heaven is like a net thrown into the sea, which collects fish of every kind. Good fish are kept and bad fish are thrown away. Likewise, at the end of time, Angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous, those who obey the Commandments. The righteous go into Heaven while the wicked are thrown into the fiery furnace."

Let's be sure to spend some day each day listening to God. He speaks to us all of the time, if we take the time to listen. Also, every so often take a few moments and review the 10 Commandments. Let's continue to strictly obey them, just like Moses did, on our journey to Heaven.
