
## **Operation Christmas Child**

### CHRIST OUR KING SUPPORTS 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

## Meditation on our Commitments to God Ez 18: 25-28; Mt 21: 28-32

How many of us recall Oskar Schindler and the story of his life portrayed in the movie, Schindler's List It was a story of how he saved thousands of Jews from death in the Nazi concentration camps by tricking the Nazis. What many of us may not know is that for years before this, he had made a fortune by using Jewish slave labor in his factories to support the German war machine. He was also very arrogant in the way he lived, drank too much, was an excessive gambler, and he slept with many women who were not his wife. His story is one of conversion and is a part of our Meditation today.

For many of us, the basic ideas from the Book of the Prophet, Ezekiel, that we are forgiven of our sins if we repent, may eliminate the anxiety we feel because of certain things we have done in our lives. We are reminded; however, that we can never give up; never expect to be saved from our sinfulness because of our prior good acts.

Ezekiel wanted the Jewish people to see that every choice they made either fosters or damages their relationship with the Lord. There was no middle ground. If the virtuous or just turned from doing the right thing; if they treated others in less than a just manner, their relationship with the Lord would die. If, however, they turned away from doing evil and did what was just and right, they would preserve their lives with the Lord.

While we are not expected to be perfectly faithful to God at all times, we must not persist in doing wrong. The choice is ours and can expect consequences, good or bad.

Oscar Schindler is certainly a good example of the first son in the Gospel from Mathew. He said no to God by the way he lived his life but then changed his mind, repented and then did incredibly good things.

It is also a reading we can understand as parents and grandparents. When we find that our children or our grandchildren have said no when we asked them to do something, but then we find they did it anyway, we feel the same love and forgiveness as the father in the Gospel when his child follows through.

It is the difference really between words and actions. It is a problem that the Pharisees had back in the time of Jesus. They were all words and no action. This really disappointed Jesus and had consequences for them.

It is a problem we could find ourselves in today. Do we say we will pray or we will go to church or we will love, honor and respect our parents or our spouse? Do we promise that we will work hard in school or at our jobs? But then we never deliver. We will have committed a greater sin than if we had said we will not do any of these things, but later change our minds and do them.

Life is not easy. Sometimes we will have the best of intentions but not be able to follow through for an assortment of reasons. Maybe we just get started on the wrong path as begin to live sinful lives like Oskar Schindler.

Let's never forget that we have a loving, merciful God who will, right now, forgive us of every sin we have ever committed. He will give us peace, joy and happiness to the extent possible in this life and He will one day welcome us into His Heavenly Kingdom.
