
Guest Speaker Brett Higgins with Fund Raising Opportunities



GOD BLESS AMERICA

Dear Brother Knights,

As we enter the month of October, a time traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary, we are called to deepen our prayer life and reflect on the mysteries of Christ through the eyes of His Blessed Mother, Mary. The Rosary is more than a series of prayers; it is a powerful meditation on the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord, and it draws us closer to Jesus through Mary.

The Knights of Columbus, founded under the patronage of the Blessed Virgin, have a special devotion to her and her Rosary. This October, I encourage each of you to recommit to this beautiful form of prayer. The Luminous Mysteries highlight key moments in Jesus' public ministry: His Baptism in the Jordan, the Wedding Feast at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, and the Institution of the Eucharist. These mysteries illuminate our mission to be lights in the world, spreading the Gospel through our words and actions.

Lastly, the Glorious Mysteries: The Resurrection, the Ascension, the Descent of the Holy Spirit, the Assumption of Mary, and the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven. These mysteries fill us with hope and remind us of our ultimate destiny – eternal life with God.

As we meditate on these mysteries, let us also put our faith into action. This month, I challenge each of you to find new ways to serve. Perhaps it's volunteering at a local charity, participating/organizing a parish event, or simply reaching out to a brother Knight in need. Our faith calls us to be men of action, grounded in prayer and committed to making a difference.

In closing, let us entrust our efforts to Our Lady. May she guide us, intercede for us, and inspire us to live out our vocation as Knights of Columbus with renewed vigor and devotion.
