Daughters of Saint Paul Presented Our Council with a Video Presentation About all their Works





Meditation: Words to be remembered for

Mark 12:18-27

Come, Holy Spirit, Come

Our Meditation today is about memorable words, words we want to be remembered

for. It will make us think: what words do we want to be remembered for?


The Gospel of Mark presents an incident from the growing adversarial and contentious relationship Jesus has with the Sadducees that will eventually lead to his crucifixion. The Sadducees were members of the powerful priestly party. Unlike the Pharisees, they did not believe in life after death. They also believed that you could only rely on the Pentateuch for spiritual guidance. The Pentateuch contained the first five books of what we now call the Old Testament: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. They believed that if it wasn't in these books, it didn't happen and they said that life after death wasn't in there. They were trying to trap Jesus with a fact situation which, they thought, would show how ridiculous it would be to believe in the afterlife.

From the time of Moses, as we were told in the Book of Exodus, if an older brother, who was married, died, his younger brother had to marry his brother's widow to keep the family property in the family. Jesus artfully and passionately stated his position in such a way that he reduced his critics to silence! Basically he said that his opponents really don't know the scripture as well as they thought they did and they don't understand the power of God, especially the power God has over death and resurrection.

Of course this will be more fully shown after Jesus is raised for the dead.

The point is that we need to always think about how our words will be remembered. Will they be for good? If we take a moment and think before we speak; take a moment to ask God for the right words to say, could our words be remembered in a really positive way? Could those times in our lives, when we are being confronted with some really adversarial situation, be remembered for when we silenced our opponents? Some of us might have a tendency to go from right to wrong with the things we say when we get into an argument, often times with the people who are the closest to us, like our spouse or other family members. We should try to take a step back, ask God for the words to say, to help us stay on the high road. Prayerfully we will take the position that God wants us to take.

Let's ask the Holy Spirit to help us when we have these opportunities to use our words to be remembered for in a good way. He is waiting for us to ask.
