We will have a 1st degree at our October Meeting. Please let an Officer know if you have a candidate.



Knight of the Month August 2015 Anthony Herlihy

Born and raised in Atlanta, Ga. Enjoyed every summer and most holidays at Edisto Beach with my grandmother and extended family and friends fishing, hunting, boating, and exploring the low country. Upon graduating from Georgia Tech accepted a commission in the United States Marine Corps serving 22years as an infantry and reconnaissance officer. A veteran of Operations Desert Storm, Enduring Freedom, and Iraqi Freedom led combat operations in Kuwait, Africa, Philippians, Afghanistan and Iraq. My last duty assignment was as a plank owner in the establishment of U.S. Marine Forces, Special Operations Command.

I met Margaret Ann Hansen in 1989 while stationed aboard Camp Pendleton, California and married after returning from Desert Storm in 1991. Since married we have moved cross country multiple times, moved and lived in eleven different homes and weathered numerous extended training exercises and operational deployments. We have raised two children, Connor (20) and Megan (18), both who are in college.

Since retiring from active duty I have started a second career with Science Applications International Corp. (SAIC) where I combine my engineering and business education with my military background as business developer for the lowcountry's largest defense contractor. I greatly enjoy a new career that keeps me engaged in national defense and close the Marine Corps and Special Operations Command. The one drawback is that the position requires a heavy travel requirement that keeps me on the road, but at least I am sleeping in hotel instead of in fox hole.



- A spaghetti dinner fundraiser will be held at CoK Hall on Wed. 9/30. Mark Lazzo is planning the event, and Mark Kennedy will be in charge at the event. Volunteers are needed to prepare, and to serve the food. The youth of CoK will assist by cleaning tables. We will also have take-out available to the homebound.
