

Meditation on Obeying the 10 Commandments

Dt 4: 1-2, 6-8; Jm 1:17-27; Mk 7: 1-8, 14-23

A wise, prayerful person once said: "When I was young, I was a revolutionary. My prayer to God was: "Lord, give me the energy to change the world". As I approached middle age and realized my life was half-gone without changing a single soul, I changed my prayer to: "Lord give me the grace to change all those who I come into contact with me. Just my family and friends and I shall be satisfied". Now that I am old and my days are numbered, I have begun to see how foolish I have been. My prayer now is: "Lord, give me the grace to change myself". If I had prayed for this from the start, I would not have wasted my life.

There are some important truths in these words. The word of God, including the 10 commandments, was implanted in us at the time of our births and reinforced when we were baptized. Through wisdom and understanding, we can make them a part of our lives. If we live the word, we will be examples to those around us. But we must not just be hearers of the word but doers too. We will help those around us who are in need. We will lead them to live their lives so that God's heavenly kingdom will await them. We will be assured of a place in heaven.

In the book of Deuteronomy, we learn that if we obey the commandments the Lord has given us, we will enjoy an eternity with God in his heavenly kingdom. By obeying his laws we will be an example to others as to the way they should live their lives. We begin the process of attaining wisdom by having a fear of the Lord and a conviction that he is always present and active in our daily lives. Understanding comes to us after a serious process of discernment. With wisdom, we come to understand that we cannot grasp what God is doing in every situation and we cannot know God's long term plans because we do not speak or act as if we are God. The most important thing is to have faith and trust that God's plan is for our good and not our bad.

From the book of James we learn that, how we are to live our lives, comes to us from God. It is ingrained in us but we need to attain wisdom and understanding in order to become doers of the word of God and not just hearers. If we humbly welcome the word that has been planted in us, we will not only enjoy an eternity with God in heaven, we will help others who are in need and help them gain salvation

In Mark's gospel, the Jewish leaders had taken the 10 commandments and added over 600 rules to go along with them. They expected strict compliance with all of the rules, which was impossible. At the same time, many of the leaders disregarded the rules in their personal live. Jesus tells the people not to focus so much on the rules, but to obey the commandments. He wants to people to come to understand that it is not what persons put into their bodies that defiles them but it is what comes out of the persons, who are not living there lives obeying the commandments, which defiles them. The things we think and say when we are angry, unforgiving, envious, and greedy, are good examples of this. Contrast this to living our lives as Jesus wants us to: loving God and loving everyone we meet, forgiving, helping where needed, being humble, and, living our lives with the peace that only God can give.

Jesus tells the Pharisees, the people and us: you disregard God's commandments but cling to human traditions. What use is it to wash our hands if we don't love the people in our lives and all the other people we come into contact with on a daily basis? When we don't take the time to listen to our children, our grandchildren or even our spouses, to find out what is really going on in their lives and then take steps to help them. If we only use religious traditions in our lives that are really no help to others, like hurrying so not to be late for daily Mass but passing by persons who are stranded in their car. Jesus is clear in his teachings: he has no problem with the persons who want to wash their hands and still serve the needs of our loved ones and the poor. His problem is with those people who make sure to wash their hands but neglect family and friends in need of something or the poor. If we go to church regularly but don't care for family, friends who really need us and the poor, our church going is in vain. We should do both: go to church and care for the poor and the needy. We must seek to serve others as well as our God.
