Commits \$1 million and seeks public donations for humanitarian aid to religious minorities

Knights of Columbus Announces Fund to Help Christians Threatened with Extinction in Iraq Donate | Prayer for Iraq The Knights of Columbus announced today that is establish-

ing a fund to assist those – particularly Christians as well as other religious minorities – facing a horrific and violent persecution and possible extinction in Iraq and the surrounding regions.

The Knights has pledged an initial \$500,000 and will match an additional \$500,000 in donations from the public.

"The unprovoked and systematic persecution and violent elimination of Middle East Christians, as well as other mi-

nority groups, especially in Iraq, has created an enormous humanitarian crisis," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "Pope Francis has asked the world for prayers and support for those affected by this terrible persecution, and we are asking our members, and all people of good will, to pray for those persecuted and support efforts to assist them by donating to this fund."

Anderson added: "It has shocked the conscience of the world that people are systematically being purged from the region where their families have lived for millennia – simply for their faith. It is imperative that we stand in solidarity with them in defense of the freedom of conscience, and provide them with whatever relief we can."

This fall, we will be having three young men join the ranks of seminarians for the Diocese of Charleston. Please keep these three men in your prayers as they discern the call of the priesthood. They have a long journey ahead of them (6 to 8 years) and need all the support that they can get from the Knights. Michael Cellars is a Charleston native and is the oldest of three siblings. In the fall, he will be in first year pre-Theology attending St. Mary's Seminary in Houston Texas and is from St. Mary of the Annunciation in Charleston. He has always been open to the idea of becoming a priest. In 2004, he attended the Pontifical College Josephinum in Ohio, but left after 18 months of study. He wasn't ready then, but never stopped thinking about going back. After leaving seminary, Michael continued to serve the Church in many capacities. After completing his degree in Business Administration at the Citadel, he decided he was ready to pursue his life-long dream to become a priest. He feels that the priesthood is where he is meant to be and where he is supposed to serve.

Rafael Ghattas was born in Alexandria, Egypt and was raised in a loving Catholic home. He is the oldest of 5 siblings. When he was a young child, his family moved to Houston, Tx and lived there for several years before moving back to Egypt. The thought about becoming a priest first entered his mind at age 16. Rafael attended World Youth Day in Australia and fell in love with the hope and joy he saw in the Church and the thirst the youth had for Jesus. After he received his degree in Mechanical Engineering in Egypt, he returned to the U.S. and settled in Myrtle Beach with his family. The call to the priesthood strengthened. After he attended group discernment meetings, he decided to apply to the seminary. Rafael is a member of St. Andrew's in Myrtle Beach and will be in his first year of preTheology in the fall at St. Mary's Seminary in Houston Texas.

Patrick Judd is one of 6 siblings and was raised in a supportive and loving Catholic family. Patrick is from St. Mary Help of Christians in Aiken. His discernment has been nourished through their support and prayers. Patrick is active in both his high school, where he is class President, and parish, where he serves as an altar boy and Master of Ceremonies. Patrick first felt the tug toward the priesthood when he was in the 7th grade. As he matured, the calling grew stronger. Once he entered high school, God put it on his heart to devote more time and prayer into his discernment. After graduation, he will spend the summer working at a camp in Brevard, NC, before beginning college seminary at Holy Trinity Seminary in Irving, Texas.

Donations are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law. Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable organization under section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code, and 100 percent of all donations collected by Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., will be used for humanitarian assistance for those Christians – as well as other religious minorities –being persecuted or displaced in Iraq and the surrounding region.

The Knights of Columbus has a long history of providing humanitarian relief and has done so following Sept. 11, 2001; last year's typhoons in the Philippines; Hurricanes Katrina, Rita and Sandy; tornadoes nationwide; flooding in Mexico; and tsunamis in Indonesia and Japan.

In addition, the Knights of Columbus has also long supported persecuted Christians. Throughout the 1920s, the Knights provided humanitarian assistance and created international awareness of the persecution of the Catholic Church in Mexico.

It is time to set your goal and plan to be on the receiving end for next year. If you need help with your degree schedule, call on your District Deputy or any of the State Officers/committee chairmen for help.

The attached charts show the status of each council for First Degrees and the Districts second Degrees for 2014-2015. If you have had a degree and the status chart does not show it, ask your District Deputy if he has submitted his Form 450 to the State Ceremonial Chairman. Until he submits his form to the Ceremonial Chairman the chart will not reflect a degree held.

Protocol Input

Worthy Grand Knights and State Council Members,

Relationship between the District Deputy and the Grand Knight

District Deputies are the personal representatives of the Supreme Knight and the State Deputy, and as such, the Grand Knights and council officers should familiarize themselves with the respect due to the important position the District Deputy holds. District Deputies should be neatly and properly dressed when attending meetings or functions, he should be notified as to the dress code for the function he will be attending. When a District Deputy visits a council or attends a function in his district, he should always be seated in front, near the Grand Knight.

The District Deputy should notify the Grand Knight of his councils in writing, or phone, and in advance (one week to ten days) when making an official visit so that all officers will

The first month of the new fraternal year has come to an end and we <u>STILL</u> have Assemblies that have not submitted their Officer Chosen Form and Annual Audit. The Officer Chosen Form was due no later than July 1, 2014. August 1, 2014 was the due date for the Annual Audit. Here is how each District breaks down in numbers needed.

Officer Chosen Forms: Florida 33, Georgia 14, Puerto Rico 8, South Carolina 11

North Carolina has 100% reported

Annual Audits: Florida 92, Georgia 29, Puerto Rico 16, South Carolina 27

Congratulations to the North Carolina District for getting all of their required Reports completed and turned in as required. Supreme cannot forward information to the Faithful Navigator and Faithful Comptroller without having their names, addresses and telephone numbers. These Forms must be completed and copies forwarded to the District Master, Vice Supreme Master and Supreme Master. Let's get the job done. Two Exemplifications have been scheduled for August - Naples, Florida on August 16 and Myrtle Beach, South Carolina on August 23. We are hoping for two large classes, so please get all the paperwork for your candidates to the Master as soon as possible.

While we are on the subject of membership, our Province finished tied for fourth out of 20 Provinces in total membership for the previous fraternal year. The DeSoto Province finished the year with a total of 80% of our membership goal. My thanks to all who helped us achieve this level. Our Province added 1,373 new members throughout the year. The highest net gain of membership was achieved by the Georgia District with a total of 76% of their membership goal (285 new members).

Many thanks to all the Sir Knights who participated in parades, public displays or religious ceremonies promoting the birthday of our nation.

By the time you read this message, the Supreme Convention will be history and I will report on the highlights of the Convention in my next newsletter. The Fourth Degree will be involved with many responsibilities during and immediately after the Convention. A relic of St. Pope John Paul II will be displayed for veneration during the Convention and the weekend immediately following it.

Donations are still being requested for the Military Chaplain's Fund. The Knights of Columbus has raised a total of \$838,619.82 to date in the first three years. This five year program to provide \$1,000,000.00 in seed money to assist Seminarians will end a year ahead of time provided we raise the final \$169,000.00 needed to fulfill this commitment. This goal is not unreasonable or unattainable as we raised more than that during each of the previous three years. We need your help. If you have not done so already, please consider making a donation to this worthy cause. Of course, we encourage everyone who has previously donated to possibly consider helping us again.
