Neil Whitman**

Neil Whitman was born in Mineola NY in 1950 to Neil and Norma Whitman. As an Air Force brat, he lived in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, the Azores, Florida, back to New York, Japan, Hawaii ending up back in Florida. He attended high school in Japan, Hawaii and Florida. There he graduated high school, attended two years of college then the University of South Florida where he received his BA Marketing in 1972.

Neil met and married Melinda, his wife of 52 years and a cradle Catholic, while living in Tampa. Neil and Melinda have moved seven times settling in Mount Pleasant in 2000. They now divide their time between Mount Pleasant and Boothbay Harbor Maine where they have a summer cottage. They have 3 daughters, Laura deceased, Lisa and Katie, residents of James Island. They have been blessed with 3 grandchildren, Owen 13, Joe 12, and Vivian 10. Fortunately, they live close by so we get to spend a lot of time with them attending basketball, football, volleyball, recitals on and on!

Neil's work life began at a Belk-Lindsey store as a stock boy and janitor. Skills attained include washing windows, running a floor buffer and cleaning toilets! Enamored with retailing, he spent thirteen years in the business. Working for Sears while in college, he completed the management training program, ultimately working in several southeastern cities.

Neil made a career change to staffing in 1981, relocating to Greenville SC to join a company that provided contract engineers. He joined a larger company in 1998 relocating to Orlando where he oversaw the southeast territory with multiple branches and 1800 employees. In 2000 he moved to Mount Pleasant and opened a Dunhill Staffing Systems franchise. In 2005 he bought out the franchise and has since operated independently. Achievements include recognition as the #1 new franchise, numerous Roaring Twenties awards and recognition as South Carolina's fastest growing small business 2014. In 2020, he turned the reins of the company over to his daughter Katie. Since it's a family business he stays very involved by mostly getting in the way.

Realizing that something was missing in his life Neil began attending the Catholic church in 1981 and after much discernment was confirmed later that year. Melinda jokes that he's a better Catholic than she is, volunteering as an RCIA sponsor and RCIA core group, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, usher, altar server, parish council member and fund raiser.

Neil joined the Knights in 1998, becoming very active in 2000 when he moved to Mount Pleasant. He's a past grand knight, was recorder for many years, was part of the degree team, manages the council website and email list, serves on the golf committee, chairs the harbor cruise, mans the microphone at the oyster roast has worked the spaghetti dinners and fish fries and was a founding member of our 4th degree assembly.

Other volunteer activities include many years with the Charleston Metro Chamber of Commerce where he was on the board of directors, the executive committee, chaired the golf committee, Political Action Committee and East Cooper Area Business Council. He is currently on the homeowners' board in Hidden Lakes where he resides.

Monthly Meditation - February 2025

Dear Brother Knights,

As we step into February, a month often associated with love and compassion, let us reflect on the divine love that binds us as brothers in Christ. 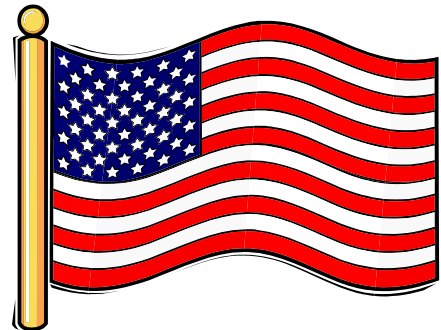
